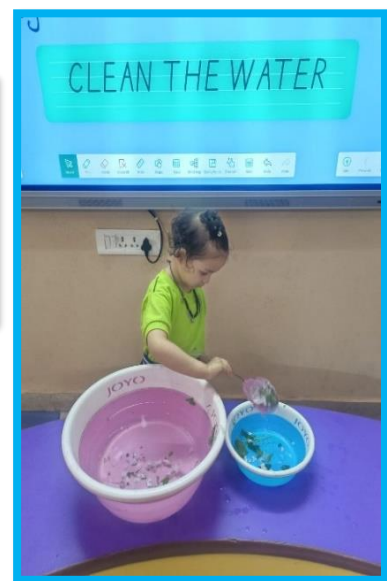

Vowel game was played, in which children moved along a path of letters to form three-letter words, enhancing their understanding of vowels and word construction.

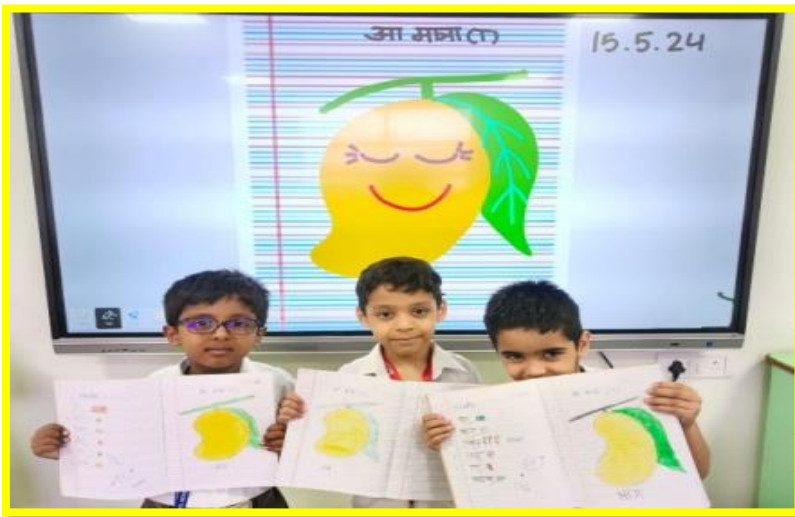
"Punctuation Punch" was a fun and interactive way for children to learn about punctuation. By associating different punctuation marks with physical actions, kids engaged their bodies and mind.



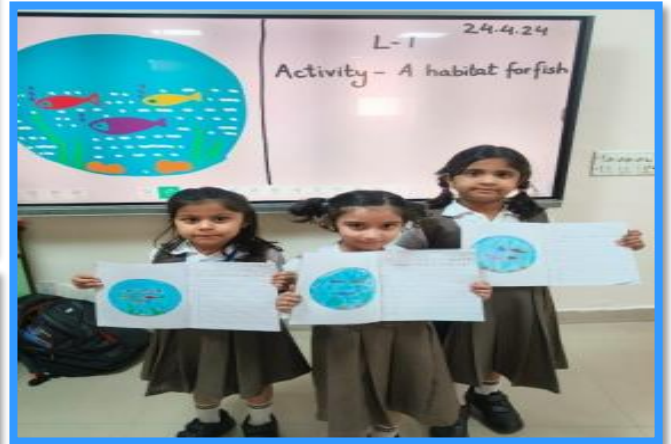
The concept of number line was creatively taught through a floor game where students physically moved on a long, numbered path.
