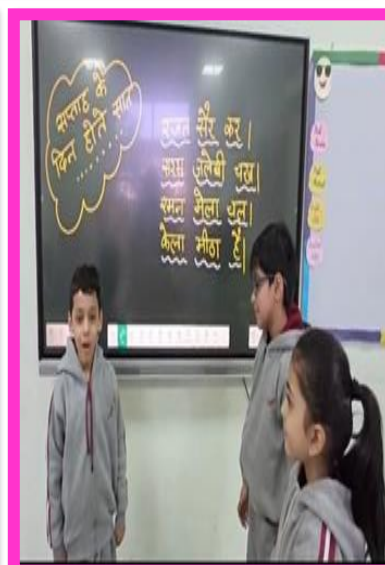
Petals for the Planet

Class I students joyfully decorated vibrant Santa caps, bringing the festive spirit to life with their creativity and artistic flair.

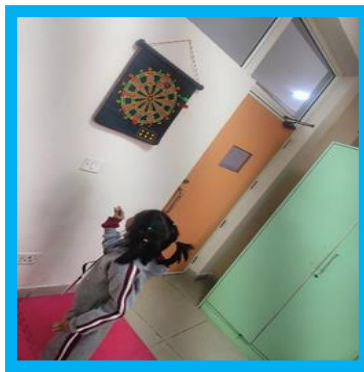


Fit and Fun Fest

A space workshop was conducted for Class I students, where they created their own balloon rockets and learned about fascinating concepts related to space.

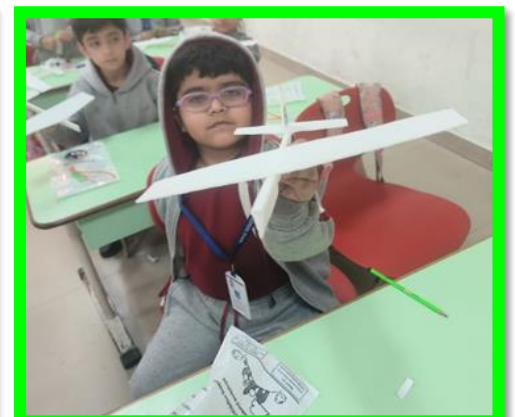


The Dart-tastic Challenge

Build it with Prepositions

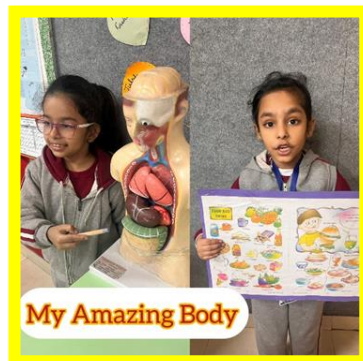
An enjoyable and interactive activity "Build a Preposition Scene" was participated in by the learners of Class 2, through which the concept of prepositions was explored.

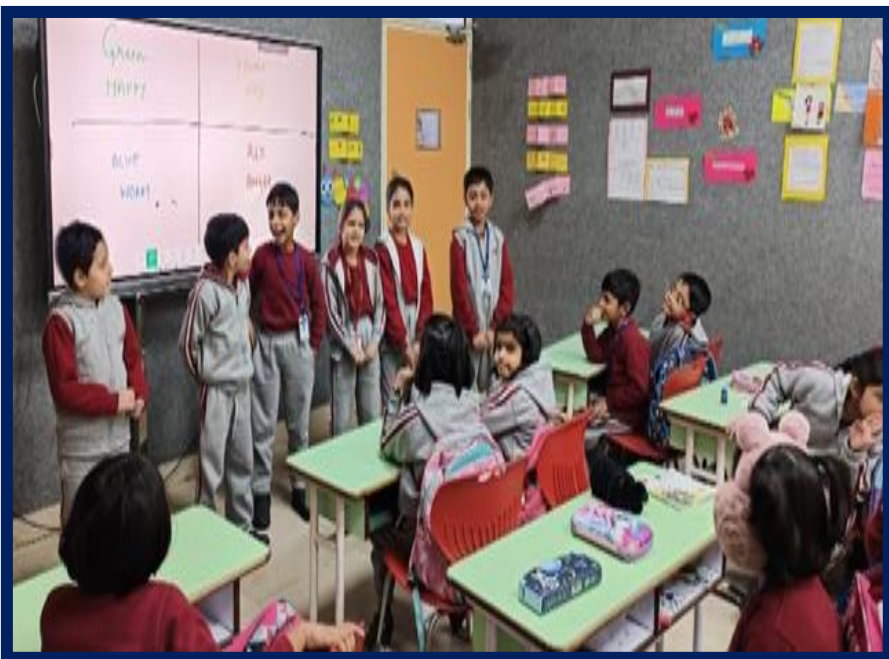
Climate Change

To introduce the "ae ki matra," paper bags (thela) were creatively designed by Class I students as a hands-on activity under the theme.

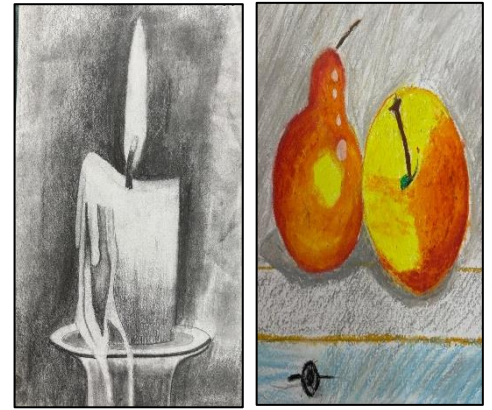

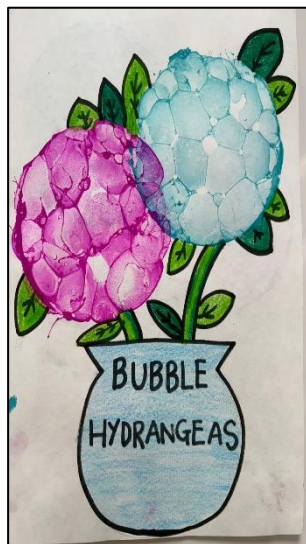
