


Kunsh Khanna Wins Best Photographer Award




Commendable Conquest @ Bharat Shiksha Expo 2024








Children's Day






INTER-SECTION COMPETITION

INNOVATIVE TEACHING PEDAGOGY





In order to incorporate a dynamic approach in our classrooms, we conducted an innovative pedagogical session of Mathematics in Class XII.

The Think-Pair-Share strategy is an innovative teaching method which began with students individually reflecting on a question or problem. They then paired up to discuss their ideas, exchange perspectives, and work towards a shared understanding. Finally, these pairs joined larger groups to share their insights with the entire class, fostering a collective learning experience.



In our neuroanatomy class, we implemented two innovative pedagogies to enhance understanding of neuronal structure: drawing neurons on wrists and creating edible neuron models using food.



These hands-on activities significantly improved student retention, spatial awareness, and engagement with complex neuroanatomy concepts.



These creative methods not only boosted students' critical thinking and imagination but also making learning enjoyable and memorable.
