#### Fire and Evacuation Drill










In an effort to enhance awareness and preparedness, a mock fire and evacuation drill involving students and teachers was conducted from classes Pre-Nursery to XII.


Students were fascinated by the architectural beauty and historical significance of Rashtrapati Bhavan, making the visit both educational and inspiring.

Her participation highlights the dedication of the School in promoting professional growth and encouraging its educators to contribute to national educational initiatives.




## CBSE Curriculum Review Meeting

#### **Innovative Teaching Pedagogy**





Innovation and diffusion of knowledge are at the heart of the growth process. At Mayoor, teachers adopt novel strategies to develop skills to think and to innovate, thus, preparing our young Mayoorians to face future challenges.

Innovation in education was exemplified as students explored the cultural and historical richness of France through creative presentations on its cities in their French class.



Paris, Lyon, Marseille, and Cities like Bordeaux came to life with vivid visuals, interactive elements, and personal out-of-the-box insights, reflecting thinking.

Grade XI students engaged in hands-on activities to explore the concept of surface tension in depth.

The first activity demonstrated how the top layer of a liquid acts as a stretched membrane, exhibiting the properties of surface tension.





The second activity used soap films, a wire frame, and thread to illustrate how liquid surfaces minimize area, causing the thread to form a circle emphasising the principles of surface area minimisation.

By blending theoretical learning with practical exploration, learners were encouraged to think differently ensuring deeper and holistic understanding of topics.
